2004 Sale Results

Bidding was spirited at the 7th Annual Wallawong Murray Grey Production Sale as new and return clients battled to secure sires and females. The sale culminated in a total clearance of bulls, topping at \$3700 and averaging \$2688. A line of very good commercial PTIC heifers also met strong competition to top at \$840 while PTIC commercial cows averaged \$800 and stud cows and calves averaging \$1100.

Bidding reached a peak when lot 9 entered the ring. The 785kg, 107cm² EMA sire, Wallawong Money Man commanded the attention of the crowd with his impressive length and exceptionally quiet temperament.

'The frame score 6.2 bull was sired by homebred sire, Wallawong Jumbuck, that was sold at our 2001 Production Sale' said vendor Lachlan James. Mr James added that Jumbuck's male progeny have averaged \$3600, demonstrating that bulls offered will go on to be excellent producers of quality stock.

Money Man sold to a local client to be joined to their herd of purebred Murray Greys. The clients backed up their initial purchase with another, lot 11, Wallawong Michaelangelo, a 645kg 18.5 month old Junior Trait Leader.

The second top selling bull, lot 12, Wallawong Monley, 760kg, again displayed a faultless temperament with sound physical characteristics and was sold to a first time client to be used over Murray Grey and Shorthorn cows.

PTIC commercial heifers topped at \$840 and were snapped up by a return client. The client backed up their purchase with the youngest bull of the draft Wallawong Naturalism, a very correct 17 month old son of Oongarra Leyland, the 1995 Murray Grey National Show and Sale Reserve Junior Champion.

Many of the new and return clients commented on the excellent quiet temperament and commercial characteristics displayed in both the bulls and females offered.
